#### **4. ISSUES AND CONCERNS**

Q- When does the hauling begin?

A- Tolko- Not until the weekend of December 4, 2006, the earliest would be November 28, 2006.

FFP- Hauling right now.

Q- Most of the traffic will be from the west?

A- Tolko- West & North, 8 or 9 % from the east. Also from the South but not much.

FFP- South, off highway roads.

Q- Are trucks on the clock all the time?

A- FFP- Only Monday to Friday.

M. Alsterlund- Concerning the Private Wood Sales-

- States that after the last meeting, 2 days later had a productive meeting discussions, did resolve some concerns.

#### **5. NEW BUSINESS**

##### **5.1 Annual Performance Review of SFM Plan, presentation Part 2 of 3. (Jeremy Beal) (PowerPoint)**

Jeremy provided the 2<sup>nd</sup> of 3 presentations on Tolko and FFP's performance in accordance to the SFM Plan for the reporting period of May 1, 2005 to April 30, 2006. Some questions were posed during the presentation (as noted below), and Jeremy plans to complete the last presentation to the PAC on December 5, 2006, with the Annual Report to be available to the PAC and the interested public in February 2007.

Q- How do you go about meeting the CFSA standard?

A- Internal Surveillance, the idea is a continual improvement.

Q- Where are the swans's located?

A- The 2 swans were seen at Hutch Lake & 1 was seen on the salt flats on the way to Zama City.

Q- What is rutting?

A- Rutting is the compaction and displacement of upper soil and organic layers which limits soil porosity and permeability is limited thereby having the potential to reduce future plant growth.

Q- If rutting does occur what do you do to reclaim?

A- Most likely go in and end up planting.

## **5.2 New Softwood Trade Deal between CAN and US- (Marcel LeCoure) (PowerPoint)**

Marcel LeCoure provided an overview of the new softwood trade deal between Canada and the US, and in particular provided information on how this may impact industry within Alberta. The following are some key points from the presentation and questions/answers that were discussed.

- New Softwood Trade Deal did come into affect on October 01, 2006.
- Frame work was formed in April 2006.
- July 01, 2006- Trade Minister and American counterpart signed deal.
- September 12, 2006- The agreement was formally signed and came into play on October 01, 2006.
- Term is 7years with clauses that allow a 2 year extension.

Q- How much does Tolko ship to the United States?

A- About 78%.

Q- The tax goes to?

A- The American Government.

Q- What is the US Government doing with the money?

A- It is going towards a trust.

Q- What about the tariffs that are coming back to forest companies to Canada?

A- The forest companies across the country paid 5.4 Billion during the last 4+ years and they will be receiving more than 80%.

Q- Are the companies in Alberta protected in amount as to how much they send over the border?

A- No, they are not.

Q- How do they go about figuring out formulas?

A- Historic data.

Q- How much play did the stumpage rates have?

A- If the stumpage goes up then the price of lumber must be going up.

### **5.3 Final Portion Annual Operating Plan (Handout) (PowerPoint) (Scott McNeil)**

Scott provided an overview of the Annual Operating Plan that showed: list of companies (Tolko, FFP and embedded quota holders), compartments in FMA that will be active, timing of operations, and generalized table of planned harvest activities & volume to be harvested. Scott fielded questions from the PAC which are listed below.

Q- Why are you taking lumber from PLP?

A- It is a business arrangement between themselves.

Q- Does it come down the highway?

A- Zama comes down the Highway 58, thru Zama Ridge.

Q- What quantity and age will be taken?

A- Merchantable coniferous, small timber and if it merchantable.  
If it is immature it will be left standing.

Q- Does FFP have a patch retention policy?

A- Yes we both do, Tolko and Footner.

Q- Do you use antiquated system?

A- We do use the antiquated system; found that this is the accepted methodology of doing that.
